Some cautiously good news about Covid-19 in Buckinghamshire, as it looks as if we may be coming to the end of the latest wave caused by the Omicron BA.2 variant. BUT there are new variants queuing up to replace BA.2, so the current fall in infection levels won't last very long. And, even with the fall, the risk of catching Covid when out and about in Bucks is still EXTREMELY HIGH. Sadly, Bucks hospitals remain full of Covid patients and Covid deaths remain high.

BuDS urges everyone to be Covid-Cautious and keep taking sensible precautions against catching Covid. Wear a FFP2 or N95 filter mask in public places, breathe clean air, avoid crowds and busy places, work from home if you can, and protect your older and vulnerable relatives and friends.

Last week, we reported the end of Omicron BA.2 wave that has caused so much illness and death in the UK in May. This week, we are sadly reporting the START of the NEXT WAVE, made up of new Omicron variants including BA.5.

The number of infected people is now going up all over the UK. Here in Bucks, we now have 1 in every 61 people infected with Covid-19. This means the risk of catching Covid when out and about in Bucks continues to be VERY HIGH.

With cases on the upturn, BuDS urges everyone to be Covid-Cautious and keep taking sensible precautions against catching Covid-19. To repeat: the chances of coming across a person with Covid in your everyday life is VERY HIGH. Wear a FFP2 or N95 filter mask in public places, breathe clean air, avoid crowds and busy places, work from home if you can, and protect your older and vulnerable relatives and friends. BuDS will continue to update you every week.

The next wave of Covid-19 is arriving much quicker than expected, and BuDS has raised the risk level back up to EXTREMELY HIGH. 1 in every 39 people in Bucks had Covid-19 as of 11 June, and the risk is almost certainly even higher today.

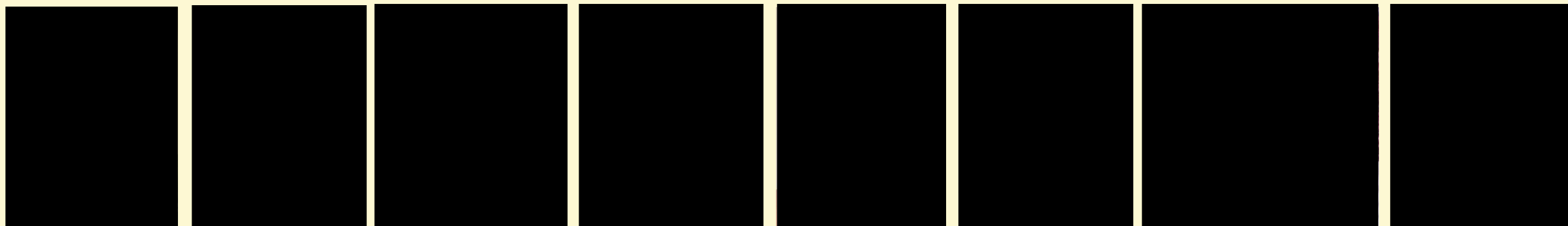

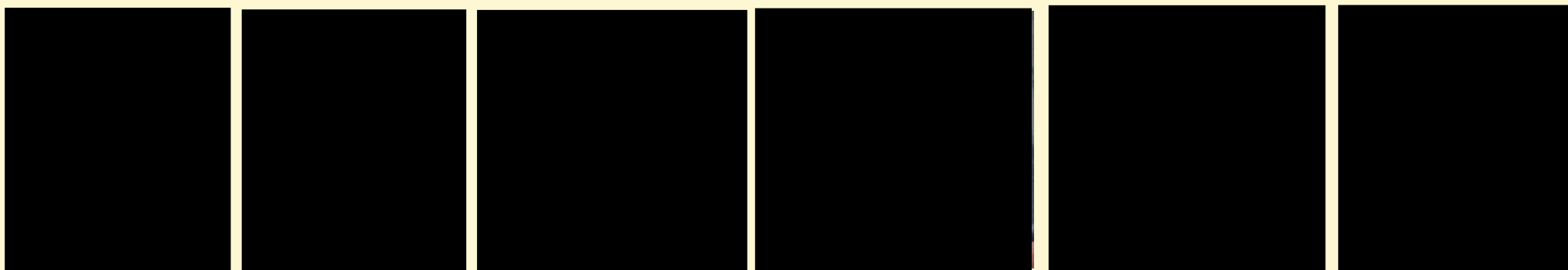

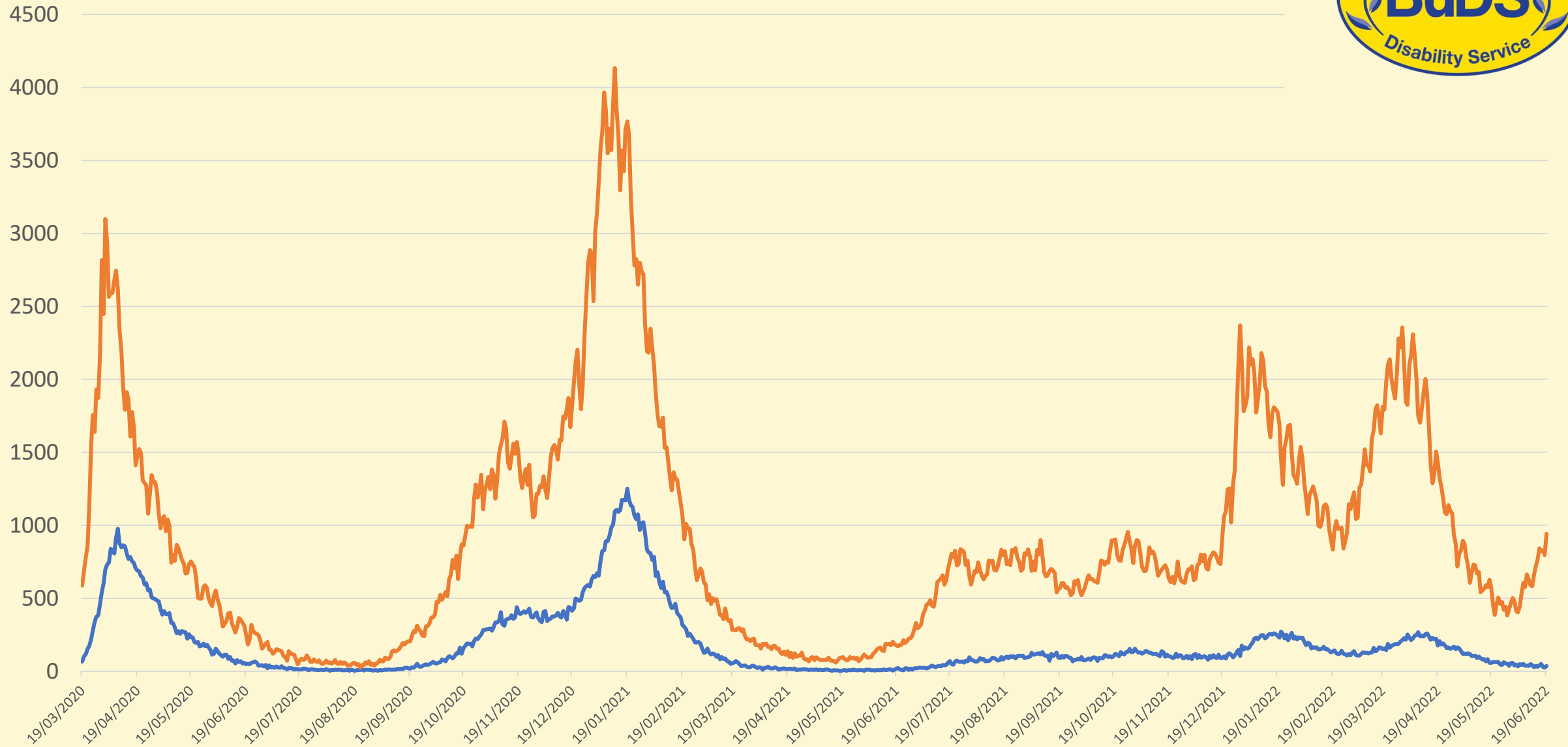

Post-Infective Conditions

Acute Post-Infective Impacts

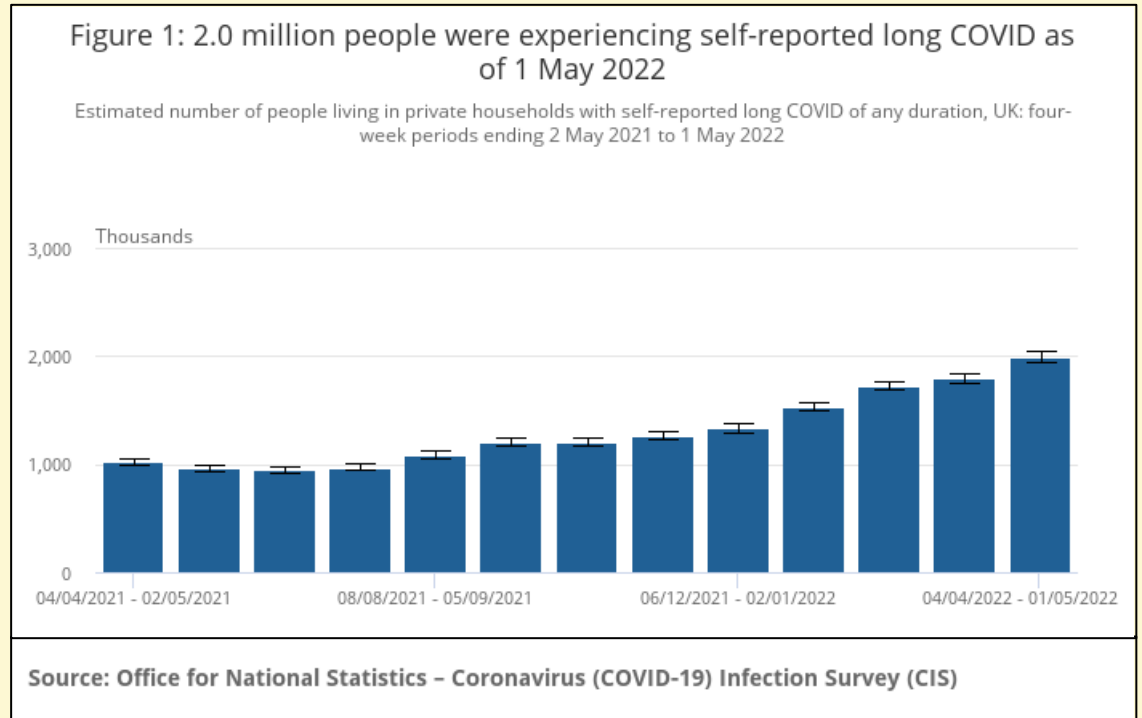
- **Blood clots**, leading to strokes, brain damage, heart attacks, and organ failure
- **Auto-immune conditions** including Type 1 diabetes, hepatitis, anaemia, Guillain-Barré syndrome etc
- **Making existing medical conditions worse**, such as arthritis or rheumatoid arthritis
- **Direct damage to organs** including the brain, liver, kidneys, pancreas, lungs etc

Long-Term Conditions

- Extreme tiredness (fatigue)
- Shortness of breath
- Problems with memory and concentration (“brain fog”)
- Difficulty sleeping (insomnia)
- Heart palpitations
- Dizziness
- Pins and needles
- Joint pain
- Depression and anxiety
- Tinnitus, earaches
- Fever, cough, headaches, sore throat, changes to sense of smell or taste
- Rashes and skin conditions

Long Covid Statistics - ONS

- 2 million people living in private households were experiencing self-reported long Covid as of 1 May 2022
- 442,000 (22%) first had Covid-19 less than 12 weeks previously
- 1.4 million people (72%) first had Covid-19 at least 12 weeks previously
- 826,000 (42%) first had Covid-19 at least one year previously
- 376,000 (19%) first had Covid-19 at least two years previously
- Long Covid symptoms adversely affected the day-to-day activities of 1.4 million people, with 398,000 (20%) reporting that their ability to go about their day-to-day activities had been "limited a lot"
- **Nearly 400,000 extra disabled people already**

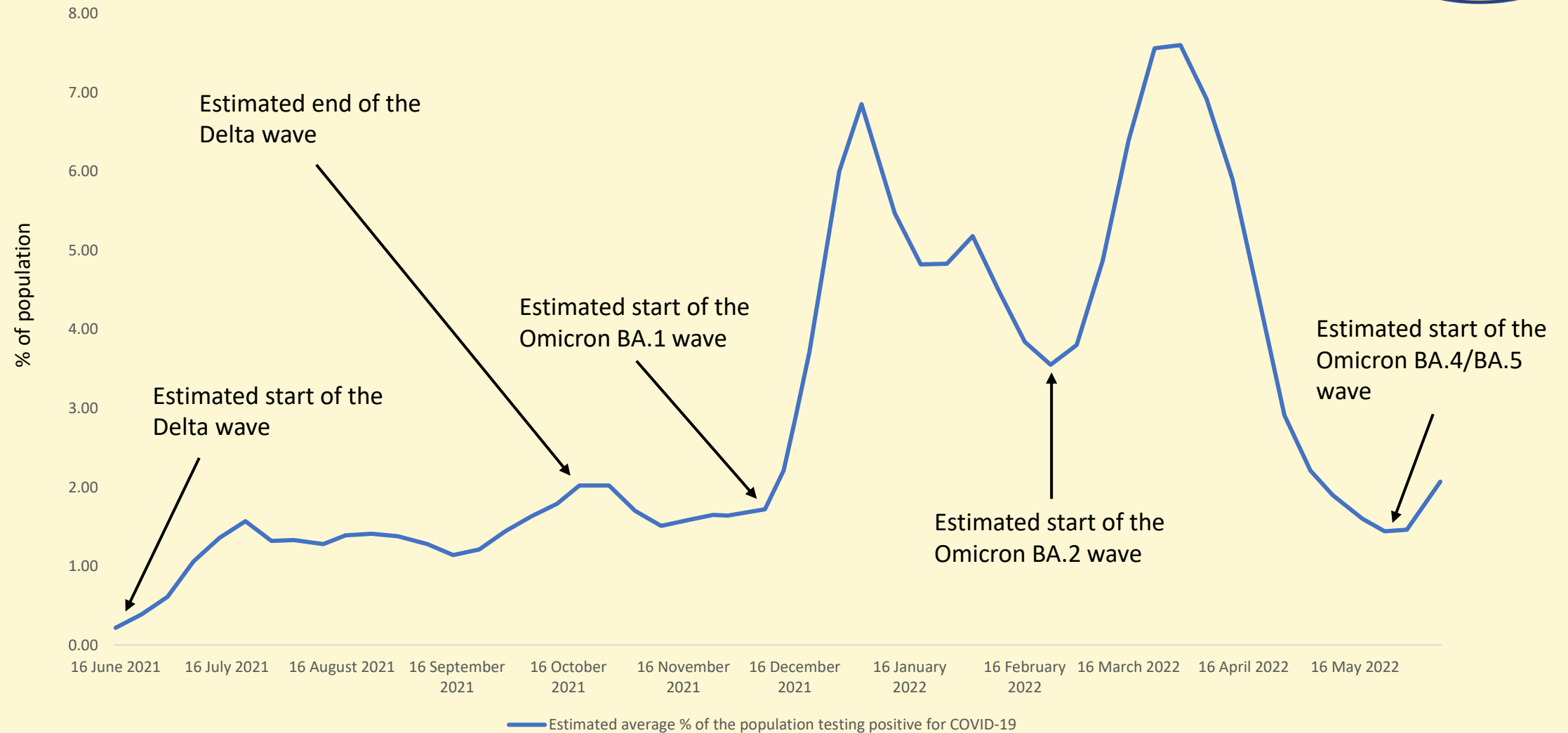
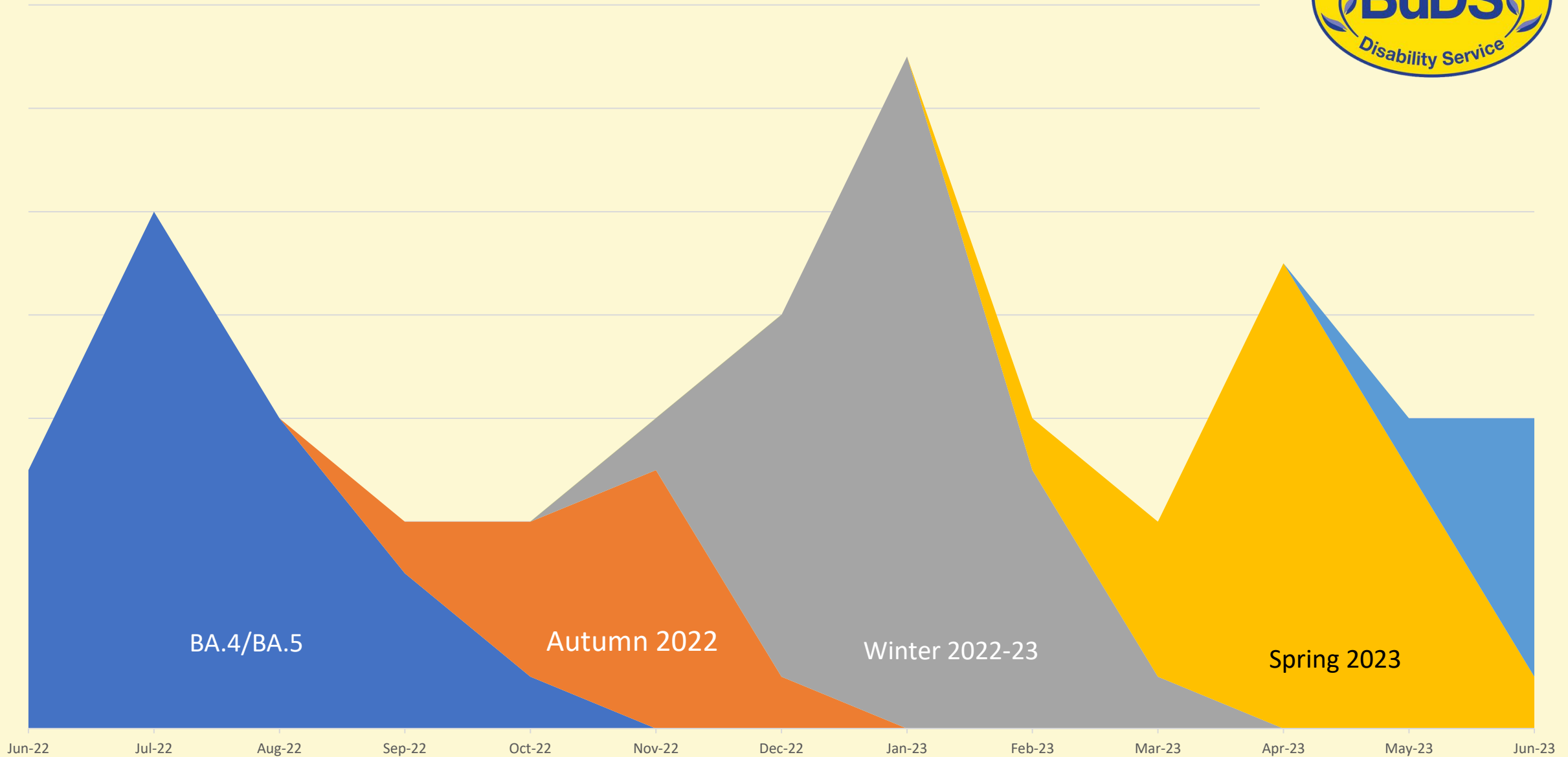
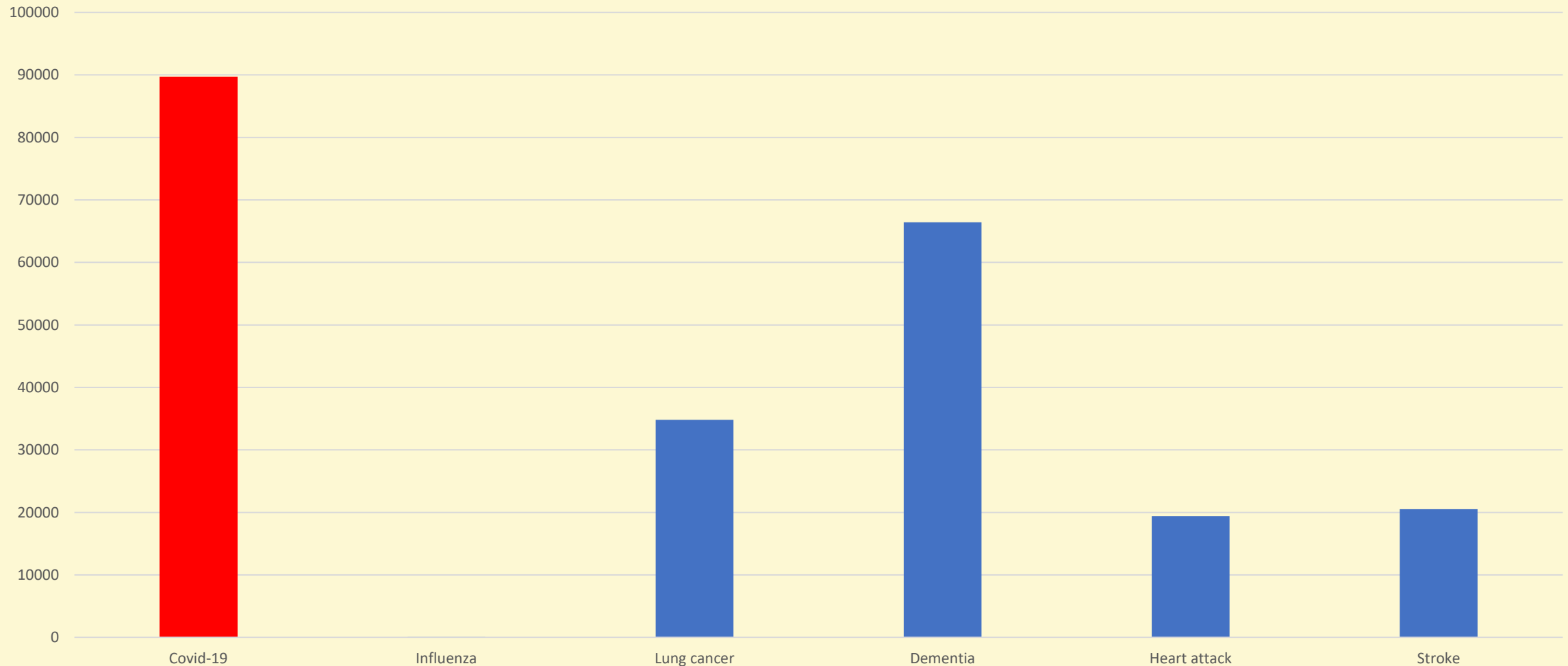


Illustration of Overlapping Covid-19 Waves - Not A Prediction!

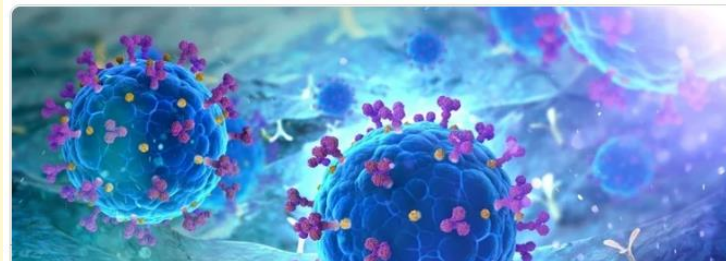
